WHAT IS ADVENT?

The word advent means "arrival." The season of Advent is observed by most Christian denominations leading up to Christmas as a time of expectancy and celebration of the arrival of Jesus Christ, our Savior born in Bethlehem so many years ago.

As Christians, we know the arrival of Christ can refer not only to his coming to earth as a baby, but also to his arrival in the hearts of believers and his triumphant return at the second coming. So all three of these themes are implied and recognized in our Advent celebration.

One of the common practices associated with this season is the lighting of colored candles that each represent a different theme within Advent. While different churches observe these themes in varied order, Lakeside's schedule this year is as follows:

Sunday, December 1st	Joy	Purple candle
Sunday, December 8th	Peace	Purple candle
Sunday, December 15th	Hope	Purple candle
Sunday, December 22nd	Love	Pink candle
Tuesday, December 24th	Christ	White candle

HOW DO I USE THIS BOOKLET?

This guide contains 5 family devotionals, which include descriptions of each Sunday of Advent, scripture readings, as well as special age-appropriate service ideas and activities – so that it can be customized for your family. The material is written with all ages of family members in mind and needs no preparation beforehand to lead.

WHEN DO I START?

For 2024 the first Sunday of Advent is December 1st. So ideally, you'd begin sometime in the week leading up to 12/1. Whether it's in the afternoon, after supper, or just before bedtime — whenever is best for your family's schedule is fine. Just make sure that you do these devotions in order and during the week to which each one refers.

As we enter the Advent season this year, we observe a sacred tradition that generations of Christians have been practicing for literally thousands of years. We hope this can become a special tradition and a meaningful time of worship for your family.

JOY

"The people walking in darkness have seen a great light. . ."

Did you know there are over 200 verses in the Bible containing the word "rejoice"? Some urge us to rejoice over God's good gifts; others command us to rejoice always, even in hard times. Rejoicing draws us closer to God and keeps us in tune with His purposes. We can even have joy during suffering when we trust in God's promises and His character.

One way to develop a "joy-full" life is to remember that regardless of what we do or don't do, our Heavenly Father delights in us and will never leave us. He sent Jesus to give us hope, forgiveness, and eternal life. With His love, He calms our fears. And with the perfect light of Jesus, He makes our imperfect lives shine so others are drawn to Him. Now that's worth rejoicing about!

PEACE

"For unto us a child is born. . . the Prince of Peace."

Where do you turn when you feel guilty, scared, or overwhelmed? Because Jesus is the Prince of Peace, we can open His word and find comfort. Something supernatural happens when we read the Bible and become still in His presence: God resets our minds as the Holy Spirit quiets our souls.

Time with God helps us realize that the gift our Father gave us in Jesus is the gift that keeps giving! Because of Him, each of us can live with boldness. His Word calms us and gives us courage, and His forgiveness covers our sins. No matter what happens, God's strength, presence, and peace will be enough for us.

HOPE

". . . one will come from you to be ruler over Israel for me. His origin is from antiquity, from ancient times."

Ours is a fast-food culture, so we often want immediate solutions to difficult situations. We might even expect God to fix our problems quickly instead of making us wait. If He takes His time to answer our prayers, we can grow discouraged and lose hope.

Do you ever wonder why He works this way? God longs for us to trust Him fully, knowing His plans are best for us. He wants us to realize Jesus is the true answer—the miracle--we need. That first Christmas, God sent His Son to be born, die, and rise again so that we could have a relationship with Him. As the One who knows us best yet loves us most, He is our living hope.

SCRIPTURE: MICAH 5:2-4, MATTHEW 1:18-23 SING TOGETHER:

O little town of Bethlehem, how still we see thee lie! Above thy deep and dreamless sleep the silent stars go by. Yet in thy dark streets shineth the everlasting light; the hopes and fears of all the years are met in thee tonight.

O holy Child of Bethlehem, descend to us, we pray; cast out our sin and enter in; be born in us today. We hear the Christmas angels, the great glad tidings tell; O come to us, abide with us, our Lord Emmanuel!

PRAYER

Lord, we know that our hope is not in the things of this world. Our hope is in our returning King -- just as people in ancient times hoped for a Savior. In good times and bad, our hope is in you, Lord.

Prayer that small children can repeat after mom, dad, or an older sibling: Jesus, you are my hope. Amen.

LOVE

"God's love was revealed among us in this way: God sent his one and only Son into the world. . ."

SCRIPTURE READING: 1 JOHN 4:7-11, LAMENTATIONS 3:22-24, JOHN 3:16-17

PRAYER

Heavenly Father, we know what love is because of you. Help us to love others just as you've loved us by sending your Son. And thank you, Jesus, for showing your love by dying on the cross for our sins and giving us new life. In your name we pray, amen.

CHRIST IS BORN

"Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord."

I wonder if the angels in Heaven threw a party when Jesus was born. Did they celebrate when the shepherds went to see the Christ child and worshipped? Did they rejoice when the wise men gave gifts to their Savior?

The symbols of Christmas point to a future party we'll be guests of, all because Jesus clothed Himself with human flesh.
